Shapechanger: The Selkie can use its action to polymorph into a seal or back into its true form. Its statistics are the same in each form. Any equipment it is wearing or carrying isn't transformed.

Actions

Multiattack: In seal form, the Selkie can use its bite or tail attack. In human form, it can make two melee attacks with its claws.

Bite (Seal Form Only): Melee Weapon Attack: +5 to hit, reach 5 ft., one target. Hit: 6 (1d6 + 3) piercing damage.

Tail (Seal Form Only): Melee Weapon Attack: +5 to hit, reach 5 ft., one target. Hit: 8 (2d4 + 3) bludgeoning damage.

Claws (Human Form Only): Melee Weapon Attack: +5 to hit, reach 5 ft., one target. Hit: 6 (1d6 + 3) slashing damage.

Elemental Control (Recharge 5-6): The Selkie can control the elements of the sea for 1 minute. During this time, it has advantage on all Strength (Athletics) checks made to swim and can control the tide and waves within a 100-foot radius.

Intuitive Sense: The Selkie has advantage on Wisdom (Insight) checks made to sense the emotions and needs of those around it.
