Trickster's Charm. The Siabhra can cast charm person at will, but only against humanoids.

Mischievous Nature. The Siabhra has advantage on saving throws against being charmed or frightened.

Actions

Dagger. Melee Weapon Attack: +6 to hit, reach 5 ft., one target. Hit: 6 (1d4 + 4) piercing damage.

Shortbow. Ranged Weapon Attack: +6 to hit, range 80/320 ft., one target. Hit: 7 (1d6 + 4) piercing damage.

Reactions

Uncanny Dodge. When an attacker the Siabhra can see hits it with an attack, the Siabhra can use its reaction to halve the attack's damage against it.
